## **Framed Wall Quilt Instructions**




## You will need:

## **Classic Metal Quilt**

- Metal frame kit found at craft stores or online
  - Large quilt requires 23" 24" frame depending on the reveal
- Small quilt requires 11.5" 12" frame depending on the reveal
- Pictureframes.com is one of many online sources for frames
  - \_ Large quilt requires  $\frac{1}{2}$  - 1 yard depending on the orientation
  - Small quilt requires a fat quarter
- Batting 2 layers
- Cardboard for backing material
- Tape

2. Cut out a layer of cardboard and 2 layers of batting to the exact size of the metal quilt.

3. Lay the fabric face down on your work surface. Layer the 2 pieces of batting and



the cardboard on the fabric. Wrap the fabric to the back of the cardboard and tape in place. Pull the fabric taut as you do this.

4. Partially assemble the frame. Assemble three sides with 2 corners and the 4<sup>th</sup> side with 2 corners.

5. Slide the metal quilt into the frame and then the fabric covered cardboard, right



side toward the metal quilt. If you don't like the tape showing you can insert a piece of poster board or very thin cardboard before assembling the frame.

6. Finish assembling the frame and add the hanging hardware. Hang it on the wall and enjoy showing off your quilting passion.



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
